# THE NOVEMBER OLYMPIAD EXAMS

The Vijay Millennium Senior Secondary School, Krishnagiri, is proud to announce the successful participation of students from Grades 3 to 8 in the national competitive examinations conducted by the **Science Olympiad Foundation (SOF) and Silver Zone** throughout November 2025. This participation reflects the school's core belief that **education must extend beyond the textbook, focusing on cultivating conceptual clarity, critical thinking, and advanced problem-solving skills essential for future success.** The Olympiads serve as a vital platform to benchmark our students' abilities against a wide national peer group and identify academic talent for further nurturing.

The month kicked off on 7th November with the ICO, followed by the NSO on the 13th, the ISSO on the 20th, and the IEO on the 26th, culminating with the massively popular IMO on 28th November. Concurrently, the Silver Zone exams added to the excitement with the IOM on 19th, ITHO on the 20th, and the IIO on the 26th November. **Overall, the school recorded a highly commendable total of 1,037 enrollments across all nine exams.** Interest of the students was **notably highest in the disciplines of Mathematics (represented by 381 participants in the IMO and 129 in the IOM) and Science (with 228 participants in the NSO).** This highlights a strong foundation and enthusiasm for STEM subjects within the school. We commend all the participating students for embracing this academic challenge and demonstrating their commitment to excellence.
