A Teachers' Orientation Programme on Ratna Sagar – CALYX was conducted for teachers at the school premises. The programme began with a **prayer song**, followed by the **introduction of the resource persons** by the Principal Sir.

The session started with an introduction to **CALYX** and its aim to **bridge learning gaps** at the **Foundational and Preparatory stages**. It was explained that the lessons are designed with **proper gradation** and are closely linked to **real-life situations**, making learning meaningful and easy for students.

The teaching **approaches** highlighted during the session included:

- Storytelling
- Thematic approach
- Skill-based learning
- Play-based learning

The programme follows the **National Curriculum Framework (NCF)** and **National Early Childhood Education guidelines**. Teachers actively shared the **challenges faced in classrooms**, which led to healthy interaction and practical discussions.

Different **assessment methods** were explained, such as:

- Quizzes
- Question-and-answer sessions
- Fill in the blanks
- Activity-based learning

Teachers were informed about an **additional workbook** for extra practice with a focus on **LSRW skills**. They were guided to compare and use both the **main textbook and workbook** effectively for better learning outcomes.

Interactive and communication-based activities like “**Most Fun Thing of the Week**” and “**Dream Place We Would Love to Visit**” were shared to improve students’ speaking and thinking skills. The use of **secret diaries/journals, gratitude sheets, and character charts** was introduced to support students’ **emotional expression and character development**.

The meeting also included information on **teacher support materials**, **easy lesson planning ideas**, and ways to encourage **student participation** in classrooms. The programme concluded with details about **course completion certificates**, **emoji-based progress card grading**, **LMS digital content**, **micro-lessons**, **project ideas**, and age-appropriate exposure to **financial literacy and basic robotics concepts**.

The session was **informative and enriching**, equipping teachers with new ideas and practical strategies for **effective and holistic teaching**.
